

Parking Lot Re-Paving Fund



The parking lot is scheduled to be re-paved this summer in June. The Board looked over the center's finances with a fine-toothed comb and has determined that this is the time to move forward with this project.

We took \$9200 on a CD that matured in February 2025, \$25,000 in gaming money from 2024, and a portion of our savings to put down a down payment on the parking lot project. Mt. McKinley Bank will finance about \$30,000 of the project. We are expecting to receive some gaming money in July, not sure how much, but the head of gaming has given us a written letter that says we can use gaming money to pay the loan. The Board has determined that even if we do not receive gaming money, we will still be able to operate the center on funds currently on hand.



Greg Corbett put together a Lego model of the center and the parking lot. As donated funds come in, a square will be painted to represent every 10 square feet of the lot that has been paid for. Donated funds will help offset the money coming from gaming that we use to run the facility.


