he was transferred to Eielson Air Force base in 1973. Besides raising their family, they were very active in the community.

William and Chrya, joined Santa's Senior Center in 2012, and also belonged to the Fairbanks Senior Center. Always willing to help out at the Center, William was involved with the hiring committee that hired both Nina Renner and Jana Howard as Santa Senior Center Administrative Assistants. And from the day of their hiring, he pitched in to help in the office any way he could.

Goldie Southwood says that his mentoring as Parliamentarian for the Board was a blessing to her as Board President. "He tried to teach me Parliamentary procedure, and some of it sunk in. When we were remodeling the Center, he was a willing helper in the moving out and moving back. It was a major project that he helped facilitate. It was a lot of work that he made fun. That is the one word I would use to describe my friend William: Fun."

Jana Howard says "William was my friend; I will miss our little fights....that always started because we both like to be right all the time. He was the first ally I made at the senior center, and he always stood up for me even when I wasn't around. I may never publish another error free newsletter without my personal proofreader. We had a lot of talks over the years about the important things in life and our experiences and he would always remind me to stop getting upset over things that didn't really matter.

Personal remembrances from myself (Ruthie Sevy):

"When the Senior Games came around he would wait and see what events no one had signed up for, then he would sign up for those events. The next day he would come into the Senior Center proudly wearing his gold Senior Games medals that he won because he was the only competitor in those events. He would tell me that is the way to do it if you want to get a gold medal. I would say to him "Oh William!" and he would say "What?"

Everyone who knows William knows that he holds particularly strong feelings against "Whiners", saying that if you see something you don't like then do something about it instead of sitting around complaining.

I've known William since 2017 and found him to be a good listener and a very good friend. He was the Parliamentarian for the Board of Directors here at Santa Senior Center for 6 years and decided to step down at the end of December 2023.

One could always depend on him to step up and help wherever help was needed. He would sit in for Jana many times when she couldn't be there to cover the office. He helped distribute food boxes, he distributed the survivor backpacks, helped move more tables and chairs then could ever be counted. He was our official proofreader, helped rewrite the by-laws, assisted with nominating committees, hiring committees, and elections. These things listed are only a glimpse of the ways he contributed to our center. His contributions were beyond measure and could never all be named.

He would play farkle with us every Mondays and Fridays, at least 3 games each time. Now picture this, most of the time he would be the only guy playing with at least 2 to 7 women. There would be multiple conversations going on and there's William listening, shaking his head at times and most of the time not saying anything until he can't help himself and would blurt something to either make all of us laugh or shut us up.

Whenever we had some kind of gathering or activity William would show up just to see how we are all doing and would socialize for a while and stay if we needed his help in whatever he could do. He's just that kind of person, always thinking of others and helping out when he can. He would visit seniors at their home when they can't make it to the Center because of one thing or another or call them to see how they are doing and if there is anything he could do for them.

Our dear friend William, you will be so missed by us all.


Single Lunch Ticket Winner Fran Hatfield Congratulations!!! Senior Recognition Day
